Gospel Reading: Luke 21:25-36

²⁵ "And there will be strange signs in the sun, moon, and stars. And here on earth the nations will be in turmoil, perplexed by the roaring seas and strange tides. ²⁶ People will be terrified at what they see coming upon the earth, for the powers in the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷ Then everyone will see the Son of Man coming on a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸ So when all these things begin to happen, **stand and look up, for your salvation is near!**"

Then he gave them this illustration: "Notice the fig tree, or any other tree.³⁰ When the leaves come out, you know without being told that summer is near.³¹ In the same way, when you see all these things taking place, you can know that the Kingdom of God is near.³² I tell you the truth, this generation will not pass from the scene until all these things have taken place.³³ Heaven and earth will disappear, but my words will never disappear.

Sermons: Seung Jae Yeon

Let us pray:

May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing to you, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.

Psalm 19:14

The best place to begin is on safe ground. For instance, your home, family, circle of friends, peer group, school or community of heart including Boronia Park Uniting Church, we may feel comfortable to begin something new. And from there, we might begin again if we already attempted but failed. There would be something that make people to unpack their dreams, opportunities of growth, and abundant giftedness. From those safe grounds, you and I have done humongous achievements, no matter how great or little they were.

I began my entire life – 26 years in South Korea and 20 years in Australia, from the love-filled nest that my wonderful parents prepared. I assume that they didn't know how to prepare the nest for their son, and then later their daughter. They were not perfect but did their best in married life to sustain the life of growing family. Thinking of their age when I was born, they were young, and still increasing their capacity in parenting and socio-economic position in life. From my parents and their loving relationship in married life, I inherited my characteristics of resilience and perseverance from my father who became responsible for his whole family at his age of 17. From my mother, I got musical talents and the inheritance of her introversion and sensitivity. In all of this, I was able to build a foundation of who I am, practising every single gene that my biological parents pass on to me. And then one generation after, Grace and I raise three children, providing them a safe ground where they can begin and begin again their foundation for today, tomorrow and years to come. I don't know whether Grace and I are

good at letting them have a good start in life. I believe that the task that I evaluate my achievement of provision of safe ground for my children will be judged not by myself but my Joshua, Daniel and Heather when they would become a parent. What I will continue is that with my best effort and heartful prayers, I keep creating safe ground for them while I am alive. I don't mean that I will make their future great by giving any form of earthly things. I mean that I will provide a sacred and safe place where they are always welcome and feel safe whenever they need it. The place where they can begin again although they attempt but fail. The place where they can find hope — a hope where they can find the love of Christ available to them all the time.

For this hope, I believe that Jesus came down to the earth, bringing the kingdom of God among his people many years ago. The kingdom was only available for those who lived in Judea and the surrounding regions like Galilee, and the city of Jerusalem, the centre for their religious life. People who lived in the part of the Roman Empire and believed in Jesus Christ as their Saviour were able to begin to dream of the coming of the Son of Man in the midst of them. However, the Romans would come and lay siege to the city. The result would not be in doubt. When that happened, those who were able to run away should do while there was time. Jesus' instructions at this point are quite specific that the followers had a duty to stay in Jerusalem or wherever they were located. Violent persecution and enforced deportation will await those who are staying in unsafe ground. The Temple and the city will be destroyed by the Roman rule and the kingdom of God seemed to be destroyed too. The disciples, followers, believers, and communities of Christ totally lost their safe ground where they could begin their faith journey and celebrate what they believed. When they were forcibly scattered and persecuted by the Romans, they seemed to lose everything, including community of faith where they belonged. What a miserable reality the early Christians and communities were confronted!

Here, Jesus speaks, saying, "People in Jerusalem, lift up your heads because your liberation is near." This is one of Luke's significant encouragements toward his community. Luke's gospel began with songs of liberation sung by Mary and Zechariah. Prophet Anna was longing for the liberation of Israel. The disciples continue to share this expectation after Easter and then Jesus approves which we can find it in the book of Acts. Joseph of Arimathea, who gave his family tomb to the disciples for burying Jesus' body, was waiting for the kingdom of God in the same way. True and faithful Jews and followers of Jesus made such liberation hope the centre of their faith. Jerusalem is not the centre of religion anymore but liberation hope in Christ Jesus is now the safe ground for everyone where all dreams, visions and purposes can grow. From there, Jesus reveals himself. Jesus manifests the kingdom of God when liberation hope appears. And Jesus manifests himself when we live out the expectation that the coming of the reign of Christ is nearer than ever, and the good news for the poor brings life and revival of God's image in each and everyone's life. Jesus invites us into this hope today. And Jesus invites us into solidarity to build a safe ground where our neighbour and we should begin and begin again our journey to the promised end. This invitation moves us more and more to bold and urgent proclamation of hope. I truly believe that you and I are called to proclaim hope in our daily life. A question to myself is this: How would I match my daily life where I struggle to hope with liberation hope that Jesus has revealed to me from the empty tomb?

The answer is the same for me as Jesus told his followers: Firstly, Jesus said, "Keep alert at all times." To me, resilience and perseverance are the key. I know I am not perfect so that I have failed so many times. But I am able to begin again because of Jesus Christ, Friend of friends. He is the safe ground where all my weary things are buried, and I am able to gain the source of hope which is the life everlasting. Every day and night I invite him into myself, relationships, and communities I belong, and every moment that is sometimes unknown to me. So I can put my trust in Jesus more and more because I choose to.

Secondly, Jesus stresses the importance of prayer life. He said, "Pray that you might be strong enough to escape these coming horrors and stand before the Son of Man." Prayer life may give me strength to keep on my feet. It's not an easy task every day. I know there are times where my eyes are shutting with tiredness and anxieties that wear myself down. But I pray because I live with it. And we pray because we can hold each other in talking to God and taking all our burdens before him, which results freedom hopes. I give thanks to God for those who pray for me and my ministry all the time. I am sure that you always include me in your prayer life, so I thank you. My mother who passes me her beautiful talents in music, and characteristics of maturity, love and sensitivity prays for me. My mother-in-law, who gave her one and only youngest daughter to me prays for me day and night. All of you may bring hope into my life and ministry here at Boronia Park. So this hope sustains me as I am making a safe ground for my children and for those who seek to find Jesus Christ anew in their life's journey. Through the prayers that we offer for each other, we are forming and becoming a community of hope here at Boronia Park. Acts 2:42 has a clear picture of how a community of hope reminds one another of what Jesus said in order to keep alert all the time while they are awaiting the coming of Jesus Christ.

"All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer."

Dear my brothers and sisters in Christ, let us remind one another of what Jesus said. And let us remind each other of how we should live as a community of hope this Advent. Let us make a safe ground where all are welcome and begin our journey with Christ Jesus. From there, or from him, nothing is impossible. Even the power of death cannot hold us back. Let us seek Christ' enabling to speak of him this advent and Christmas, and live hope for him and for our neighbours as we are awaiting his coming as human form, Christ Child, the hope for whole God's creation. Amen.
