So I hope the new year has started well for you even though we are all aware of the Covid pandemic reaching new emergency levels in Australia and especially in our home state of NSW.

Irrespective of the challenges we all face as a society and community we still must have set our New Year's resolutions. Have you set yours as yet? I am happy to share mine. But my top 3 resolutions for 2022 are: i) becoming a better cook in vegetarian meals, ii) get away with the family as much as possible for breaks and iii) being a better father and husband and servant of God.

SERMON

2022 is here and now and I am still on holidays (well at least for another day). Yes my return to work starts again tomorrow but I have enjoyed two and a half weeks of holidays so far and I am very grateful. I was down in Melbourne for some 10 days with the family and although I returned almost a week ago, Lenny and the young adults only returned last night. 2021 had been a great challenge for all of us and that is a huge understatement I know. And I know that we are still amidst very challenging times and the short-term future is still filled with great uncertainty.

As last year we had been in lockdown for over 100 days in Sydney, I started to focus on the garden. Like many of you, being house bound you tend to look outside your own windows and notice the trees and plants. Similar to Seungjae sharing his stories of growing vegetables in his backyard, we also grew vegetables and herbs but my passion has been on native plants and trying to grow native plants from seed.

How many of you watch Gardening Australia on the ABC? I love watching Costa Georgadis and his team or crew of gardening presenters from all over Australia. They provide great tips for growing plants and how to get the most of one's garden. They also have great tips on native plants and how to grow them as well.

I love the outdoors and use my time as best as I can to visit nature's most special places. Yes I love the mountains and rivers but the forests and plants of the reserves and national parks I visit are so very special as they live and provide us oxygen to all breathing life whilst providing habitats for so many of species of life (fauna and flora) that predates humans.

My travel life memories are always dotted with the majesty of forests whether it is the groves of giant sequoias of the US Sierra Nevada (the world's tallest trees), the ancient rhododendron forests of Nepal or the gnarled beauty of thousand-year-old Juniper trees on China's sacred mountains (like Huashan), the coachwood trees, flooded gums and red cedars of the mid north coast of NSW or in my recent trip to Melbourne, the giant mountain ash of the Dandenong Ranges. These moments of my memories of the true grandeur of nature are for all ages and how its conservation and preservation is so key to its survival. But even these grand trees of enormous scales start off from seed. Seed that has been nourished, nurtured by nature and its abundant blessings. Trees of such immense standings can take hundreds if not a thousand years to develop. What starts small can be of immense stature over time.

Being a Sydneysider, the waratah flower is a truly special plant for me. Trying to get them to grow well is one challenge but trying to get them to flower is yet another one. Having them in large pots has its pros and cons. One on hand it is easy to move when a heatwave is on BUT I have to keep adjusting the size of the pot as the rootball grows in size. I know its kind of first world problems.

Back at my home with my almost 600 square metres of real estate I am a novice farmer or junior horticulturist as I experiment with seedlings and seeds and beating weeds, insects and understanding shade, water and soil nutrition.

The Bible is full of metaphor and allegory when it comes to references to trees and plants. Think of the tiny mustard seed growing to the large mustard tree, the garden of Eden, the cedars of Lebanon, the parable of the good seed and even the reference to the wheat and the chaff that is mentioned in today's reading. Seeds are like us (people). We grow in an environment (soil) that is provided nutrition through family, friends and God and we hope to bear fruit (our good works as an example).

As an avid gardener, we either grow plants for landscaping (beautifying the look of nature) or we plant for fruits or herbs to consume or we plant for reasons such as conservation or education to better understand how we best work with plants. I recall Costa from Gardening Australia say you don't plant a \$50 plant into a \$5 hole. Plants need the right nutrition and so you don't waste a young seedling or young sapling in the incorrect soil type or soil without appropriate nutrition.

It is the same with us as well. As Christians we value the family and our friends and how our relationships with each other forge us and directs our path and pursuits. But we are not complete without God. We enter God's family through baptism by following Jesus and we let the Holy Spirit live within us to guide us through the paths of life.

Have you ever been to some of the best gardens in the places you have visited in your lives? Note how plants co-exist with each other very well and how some thrive in the ponds, in the shade and in the full exposure of the sun. A master gardener at work knows its plants, its soil, its environment.

God is our master gardener. God knows our talents no matter how small they are, God knows our place and how we figure out our purpose to serve in God's kingdom. The Holy Spirit is some times

conveyed as a flame, the wind or even the dove. If we let the Holy Spirit live within us and trust God's guidance we as seeds of God will find the right soil and take root so that we can flourish. We do this not in isolation but with community. We are all nurtured when we come together and we all grow in love for each other and for God.

Like the reading in Acts, the Samaritans (an old disputed foe and relatives of the Jewish kingdom) find the blessing of the Holy Spirit in community with their Abrahamic cousins when Peter and John visited and assisted them.

So let God be our spiritual gardener, helping us find the right spot in life and how we can then thrive and be fruitful. AMEN.

Dear creator God,

God of light which allows life, let us be useful seeds in your garden. Let us find our rightful purpose and passions to pursue. Let us produce wonderful fruit which can in turn benefit and feed others. Lord, let the Holy Spirit live and burn within us guiding us through our lives and leading us through challenges and obstacles but ensuring we find the good soil near springs to be firmly planted in.
