84 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! ² My soul longs, yes, faints for the courts of the Lord; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God. ³ Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. ⁴ Blessed are those who dwell in your house, ever singing your praise! Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

Jesus Presented at the Temple

²² And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons."²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷ And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸ he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

- ²⁹ "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word;
- ³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation
- ³¹ that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,
- ³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel."

³³ And his father and his mother marvelled at what was said about him.³⁴ And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall

and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed³⁵ (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

³⁶ And there was a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived with her husband seven years from when she was a virgin,³⁷ and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸ And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

Kids Talk Rosemary Brook

School's back for 2022 and I hope you're loving being back with friends or enjoying the excitement and increased independence of being in Year 7 at high school!

I loved high school because I learned so many new things and some of these have stayed with me all my life – like learning French and Indonesian; taking up what was then the brand-new subject of Asian Studies; studying history; and developing great friendships – a very dear best friend I met on Day 1 of Year 7!

Going to high school gives you more independence but also more responsibility.... I'm sure you're finding this out already.

All around the world, young people are returning to school. Maybe you've heard about some interesting or unusual schools. I love this one in Paris – it's worth looking up and it can't help but make you happy!



Ecole Maternelle Pajol – Paris (Eng. Pajol Preschool)

Everyday, when little ones come to school, even if it's overcast or raining, they still see...? Yes, rainbows! This is in fact an older building in Paris that has been revitalised, largely through these wonderful colours.

But how many children are out of school in the world? According to UNICEF, Over 265 million children are currently out of school and 22% of them are of primary school age.

This is not a new problem and in fact, it was way back in the 1750s, before many Europeans had ever visited Australia, that some people in England started schools in England for poor children who were 'out of school'. These children had no hope of affording a private tutor to teach them which was the way many better off children were educated.

The idea of schools for poorer children really took off in England in the 1780's. Robert Raikes was a newspaper owner and editor in Gloucester in England and he could see what was going on around him. He set up schools on a Sunday helping poor young people (chimney sweeps) learn to read and write. He chose Sunday because that was the one day of the week when poor children didn't have to work... in a factory or a mine. Many children worked at least 12 hours a day on every other other day of the week. Many of them had no parents to care for them: they had either died or were in prison and as you can imagine, many young ones just ran wild in the streets on Sundays, often stealing and fighting.

Robert Raikes was a man of faith and together with his friend the Reverend Thomas Stock in time they had 100 children aged 6 to 14 attending their Sunday schools. They taught reading and writing for part of the day and Bible lessons for the other part. The children's behaviour started to improve and people began to notice.

When Robert Raikes was sure that Sunday schools were really helping children, he used his newspaper to promote Sunday Schools and they started to take off in lots of places.

Sunday Schools were also started in Sydney and one of the very first Sunday schools in the colony was not so far away- at Parramatta Anglican Church where Sunday School still runs.

Now today, we are welcoming Margaret and Lenny as Sunday School teachers for 2022. We know how important they have been to your learning about Jesus and how to show God's love to others. They have done this over many years and we are just so thankful to them.

In closing, keeping on learning is just so important – right throughout our lives.

As we get older, we try to gain wisdom as well. Jesus, even as a child showed great wisdom. By wisdom, we mean, being able to make wise choices based on our understanding of what is most relevant and most important in a situation or in facing a problem.

Are we becoming more wise? Learning at school and at church and at Sunday School helps us to develop the wisdom that God wants us to have.

Let us close in prayer.
