#### Sermon

During the past week, I had such a wonderful opportunity to join a retreat with some other minister friends of the Presbytery. It's called 'Sydney Central Coast Presbytery Ministers Retreat' which is designed for ministry agents to have their own gathering out of area or region of work and family. Since I arrived in Boronia Park in 2014, I have joined the retreat every year except the past three years due to Covid-19. I missed it so much because the retreat gives me always meaningful moments with friends and tranquillity where I can deepen my personal relationship with God, seeking where God's purpose leads my journey. From the Monday afternoon till the Wednesday lunchtime, I was learning, discerning, singing, talking, putting in silence, walking, eating, and giving God my own self. I was able to be fully 'me', 'I', and 'Seung Jae' during the retreat. Then I came home with hopes and findings from the space where God prepare me his presence lending me his hand and saying, "Seung Jae, let us go another mile together. I go with you as you go with me." I said to myself, "Hallelujah!" (Woops! We don't say this during Lent, do we?) I would like to express my genuine gratitude to the church council and the congregation who willingly give this opportunity every year. Thank you.

During the retreat, I could refine my own definition of how to pray. I am a writer of prayers, leader of prayers and minister who offers prayers if needed. I would say this retreat I had a moment to immerse myself into prayers that would have been prepared for my soul. As we briefly practised in the beginning of the service, I drew my soul to a deeper level of dwelling in prayers with words and the Word of God. The retreat leader Rev. Penny Jones, who is one of UCA ministers transferred from the Church of England, introduced her findings that we might go another way or different direction to see and feel God's presence in the moment of personal devotion, silent

time, meditation and contemplation. For instance, she used a practice called *Lectio Divina* which is a Latin for "Divine Reading". We read one passage a couple of times, with different voices and even translations including Korean. I was told to choose a word or phrase each time I heard someone read the passage. Then I was asked to write any form of writing and develop the writing to a form of poetry — French pantoum, Japanese haiku or any. As a big fan of sonnet, I wrote one by using my findings. This sonnet-like poetry writing is my first one that I use my own words.

You grow up well last nineteen years Growing will never be ceasing until an end I grow old as a father with two wise ears Becoming my son and my good friend

You and I thankfully have faith in Christ not in a beast When our journey needs to say goodbye to each other For us and for many let us have a priceless feast Promising the table is big enough for all together

I will hold you tight in the most sacred part of my heart
I will bear all suffer and rejoice
You and I create most days wonderful till the universe sets us apart
Choosing all the time for us better choice

There used be the most precious love dwelling Remember there used to be for us like a flash

I felt that God invited me to another chance this season of my life. I would say not 'second chance' because God has given to us and will continuously give us a series of 'another chance' to me and to all of us when we believe and where we seek to find it. Our God is a God of another chance who knows us way better than us and encourages us to continue our journey forward. Let us go another mile or turn around the corner of hardship, challenges, frustrations, or difficult relationship with someone who we know and love, and then see God willing waits for us with his purposeful

and fruitful outcomes. While I was practising new habits of prayer with words and the Word, I could meditate on the presence of God who always provides me a better choice and taps on my shoulder to comfort me. I could confess that my God is a God of another chance who makes me never give up and waits patiently. He is always giving and forgiving without any cost but only the deepest love that we can find from Jesus Christ who gave himself up for us without any cost or honourable responses but his faithful response to God's call upon him. We can find the character of God that gives all human beings another chance today and the days to come.

In his ministry, Jesus kept knocking the door of Judaism that was the centre piece of religion of the early followers, believers and hearers of Jesus' 'kingdom-of-God-among-you' message. All the values, no matter they were well received or not by Jesus' contemporaries, were like a safe that could never be opened or dealt with other values. Particularly Jesus' message, which proclaims the kingdom is here and when you believe the kingdom is yours and it's you, was unlikely welcomed by Judaism and its religious leaders and power holders. But Jesus cried out for Jerusalem (we learnt this last week) which is the centre and the most important symbol of Judaism and continued his journey of giving another chance to those who lived in the closed circle as well as people who were displaced and then placed at the margin of the religion. Thus, Jesus wanted his hearers to hear the voice of repentance as God's another chance not see any concept of karma. He strongly rejected it. He defined that Pilate's mass killing was as Pilate's mass killing, and not something Pilate did under God's authority. Brothers and sisters in Christ, once again, a God we believe and worship this moment hates violence but loves justice and peace in understanding each other. Please remember this.

Jesus' plea for repentance is not showing any form of violence, injustice or disrespect. He didn't want his hearers to act out of fear but out of understanding and good will. For us, he keeps knocking the door of heart until all hear the Word of God and then turn away fully with our own decision and commitment. In responding to God' Word and call, what we should remind each other is that it is easier to turn away than to hold it.

Simply remind each other that we are a people of another chance given by God in our faith journey. So giving another chance to each other is one thing that the church shall keep practising while we are called church. There is no one like Jesus who always gives another chance for us. As a Christ follower, I believe that we are called to become another chance for those who needs it but don't know where and how to get it. Let's find where Jesus is from the parable of the fig tree.

The consequence is that the fig tree planted in the vineyard is given another chance according to the advice of the gardener. I don't say "It is a happy ending or good ending." This ending doesn't end here. The gardener might want to sit down with the owner of the vineyard and suggest better care for the fig tree. There might be times when firm action is required such as adding fertilisers which means investing funds and assets or pruning branches which might need more skills and experiences to cut it down, because the fig tree no longer bears the fruit which is intended. All this action begins by another chance of the owner who loves and wants more fruit from it. And there is the gardener who stands in the middle for the fig tree, mediating and reconciling the relationship. We might find Jesus from the image of the gardener. He chose to go for his people another mile with patience and compassion in order to bear the fruit that they find the kingdom of God in and among them. The parable here may give more voice to the heart of Jesus' teaching on his love and compassion than surfaces in this passage. I give thanks to Jesus who gives us all another chance to turn and then continue each other's journey instead of giving up when we face challenges in life.

I would say that I am a person who has received a lot of 'another chance' in life especially my 21 years living in Australia. There have been so many times for me to have excuses, saying sorry, please, asking, "Can you give me one more chance?" Most of those times, people around me have given me another chance. Everyday all of you may give me another chance to serve and work with you. What I am trying to say here is that giving another chance has mighty power and receiving another chance forms people's character into humble ones. Can you see that the dynamic between giving

and receiving another chance is how God may work and transform all human beings into God's people? Think about who God is in the life of Abraham and Sarah, Joseph with coat of many colours, Moses, the Israelite in the wilderness, Prophet Elijah, King David, fisherman Peter and the Twelve, and Apostle Paul. They had all another chance in life and their ministry. God rejected any concept of karma but reminded them who God is for them by giving another chance. So they turned away and held it tight for their entire life. What they achieved in the history of God's people has its beginning of another chance. From there, they were converted, prepared, moulded and sent in order to tell many people that God is alive in and among the people. We are the recipients of those who have had another chance.

This Lenten season, I would like to encourage all of us to make a space of giving and receiving another chance to each other, family members and neighbourhood. What if people might turn away from where they used be because of your giving another chance? What if you might live fully who you are by receiving another chance from others? Let your people know God gives everything without cost by your giving and receiving another chance. The passage from Isaiah 55 affirms that God is so giving but never asking any price. This is what God only wants us to do.

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"Incline your ear, and come to me;
hear, that your soul may live;
and I will make with you an everlasting covenant ... (v.3)
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"Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near ..." (v. 6)

God is near and nearer than ever before. He proved this when he sent one and only Son for us, and when Jesus Christ died for us all to give life everlasting in God. He proved this when the Church was born on the day of Pentecost, and when we have become part of this church here at Boronia Park. Each passing day adds more stories that we Boronia Park Uniting People are all God's people of not only giving another chance in our past but becoming a Christ's community that bears the fruit to share with

generations to come. I believe that we are producing fruits day by day because we are all giving another chance in our everyday living and ministry. Let us cast ourselves in the role of the gardener.

Amen.

[Note: I don't apply at all today Jesus' teaching of repentance into any situation of those who are in hardship. And I reject expressly any concept of karma in regard to the suffering of all Ukrainian citizens. Any form of violence including war must not gain another chance. I urge the Russian government to stop their invasion of Ukraine right now. This kills young soldiers both Ukraine and Russian troops. This causes innocent Ukraine mothers with their young ones displaced from home and Russian mothers who sent their young ones in war broken-hearted. I also urge the Australia Government to speak up our voices of peace and zero tolerance against this senseless war in the soil of Ukraine. The Government can dare to demonstrate our strong opposition to any form of war criminal activities. Again, no 'another chance' and may God judge of this war on behalf of all human beings.]
