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Minister's Sharing of a Reflection on Psalm 81

The Psalms in the Bible see us all as a people of God who may have prayers and songs everyday. They allow us to offer prayers and sing songs anytime if we could do. The Psalms invite us to express without hesitation our emotion and feeling whenever and wherever we need. They remind us that we can always come to God no matter what circumstances we face right now. Next five Sundays I will share my reflections on five psalms from the lectionary readings – Psalm 71, 81, 139, 14 and 79. I am so excited to do this commitment for us all because it will be my first attempt to preach on the Psalms that reveal the true character of God in *us*.

Psalm 81: Listen to God When He Calls

Do you believe that God has eye upon you? If your answer is 'yes', I would say that we gather here this moment to give thanks and praises to God who has eye upon us all the time. The Church, especially a Sunday church is the most place where we collectively worship and give praise to God. We sing hymns and songs in worship. We could sing aloud songs of joy and thankfulness while our music team – Bianca, Grace and Isabella – is leading worship. The minister could play guitar and some other instruments when we sing. We have good old hymns to sing and sometimes new songs that we need to get used to before singing them freely and immersing deeply the meaning of the lyrics. And you may raise hands and move your body, in response to God's presence in and among us, expressing thankfulness to God who dwells in you to give strength and guidance. As one of worship leaders of this congregation, I am honoured to witness that you express your own faith in Christ and strength given by God by giving thanks and praises in our public worship. I believe that God would love seeing us all respond to Him in the time of worship, where God has eye upon us and heart for us to pray.

Psalm 82 begins by giving praises to God who gives strength all the time. Asaph, the song writer and with him, the choirmaster invited the whole Israel congregated in a special season's gathering to remember who God is for them. They would have had music band that performed many instruments such as vocals, percussions like tambourines, string instruments like lyre and harp, and trumpet. I guess that those ancient instruments created its unique sound effect and impact to people gathered there, lifting up the mood of celebration. In verse 3, the sound of trumpet at the new moon and at the full moon, let people know that it was the time for their feasts to celebrate. Blowing Shofar, a ram's horn trumpet, is still used in Jewish religious ceremony. When the Inter-Church Council of Hunters Hill and Gladesville used to have a combined Good Friday walk called Way of the Cross, Shofar was used as a signal at each station. Its unique sounds made the event solemn and sacred. The trumpet sound is like our Call to Worship that is said in the beginning of Sunday worship service. When trumpet was blown, people was called to have their full attention to God who has eye upon them. And they celebrated who God is for them. Then hearing the sound of trumpet, they were reminded each time of what God had done for their ancestors and themselves. Verses 4 to 6 sing to God who brought them protection, liberation, guidance and strength when their ancestors were placed in wilderness. It says this:

For it is a statute for Israel,

a rule of the God of Jacob.

He made it a decree in Joseph
when he went out over the land of Egypt.

I hear a language I had not known:

I relieved your shoulder of the burden;
your hands were freed from the basket.

People who listened to Asaph and the choir singing would have been inspired and encouraged, elevating their hearts of thankfulness of knowing their relationship with God and identity as God's people. They brought courage to each other in singing aloud the song and reminding of what God had done for them. God was faithful for their ancestors. God is for them the source of joy and hope for their future no matter what circumstances they faced. Do you believe that God has eye upon you now? Yes, God is looking upon us now so that we have strength in our faith journey to continue.

At verse 7, there is a change of tone. It says this:

In distress you called, and I delivered you;
I answered you in the secret place of thunder;
I tested you at the waters of Meribah.

Here, the waters of Meribah is recorded in the Old Testament, Book of Numbers 20. Nearing the end of the Israelites' 40 years in wilderness, God led them to a desert place where there was no water. The community turned against Moses and his leadership. God told Moses to gather the assembly and speak to the rock. Then Moses struck the rock twice with his staff. Water came from the rock, as God had promised. But God immediately told Moses that he would not bring the children of Israel into the Promised Land. Because he failed to trust God enough to honour Him as holy. God showed Moses the Promised Land, but did not let him enter in. God's eye was upon Moses but he did not know where God's eye looked upon. God tested him whether he listens or not. God wanted to contact eyes with Moses. God wanted him to listen whatever He said. Then God didn't punish them but expect the Israelites to understand God's holiness that can only be kept by God's holy people. This was the lesson for the descendants of the people in wilderness when they sang this psalm. The lesson from their ancestry and history reminded the gathered people of the significance of listening to God. This was key for the gathering where this psalm 81 was sung because the

Israelites affirmed and declared their faith in one God from hearing the word of God. *Shema Yisrael Adonai eloheinu Adonai ehad*.

Hear O Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord is One. (Deuteronomy 6:4)

And Apostle Paul once said in Romans 10:17 the significance of listening that forms one's faith in Christ.

So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

In verse 13, the gathered people were called to hear and discern the word of God that would make them holy as God is holy. During celebrating their feast, while those instruments were played, the trumpet was blown, they remined each other that they shall live on the land God promised if they obey God from hearing the word of God. It says this.

Oh, that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways!

After this service, we will have a congregational meeting. This meeting is a special one because we will elect new members of the Church Council. For this, Alan, Jenny and Justin have been nominated. We don't know yet where God has his eye upon. But we do know those nominees are faithful to God and to all God's people here at Boronia Park Uniting Church. The current Church Council has prayed for this special meeting, and the election of new council members, discerning what God wants us to be as Council of the congregation. I also believe that you have all discerned and prayed for those nominees since the notice of meeting was announced. This will be a momentous meeting for the life of Boronia Park congregation and for our future journey. For us this moment, I would like to ask this question to us all: Do you believe that God has words to speak to us now? Let us listen to God and obey what God wants us to be.

As I conclude, I want to have words to the nominees and the current Church Council members. Earlier, I mentioned about trumpet or shofar used in the ancient Israel ceremonies. That was not all. There was another use of shofar in the history of Israel. Shofar was used by them as a battle signal, alerting that it was an emergency situation. Blowing shofar meant to call the whole community to get ready for battles. Blowing shofar was an important act for their life or death of the community. For all of you elders and council

members, your role is to blow shofar when the Church needs to seek to find where God has his eye upon and to drop everything and pray together. For this, you listen to God carefully and discern his call and will all the time. When you listen to God in prayers, study about the word and any services you commit, God will satisfy us all. In verses 14-16, it says this.

I would soon subdue their enemies and turn my hand against their foes.

Those who hate the Lord would cringe toward him, and their fate would last forever.

But he would feed you with the finest of the wheat, and with honey from the rock I would satisfy you."

Amen.
