Narrator: We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you,

Jesus in Gethsemane

Mark 14:32-50

Narrator: They went to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, Jesus: 'Sit here while I pray.'

- N: He took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be distressed and agitated.And he said to them,
- J: 'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and keep awake.'
- N: And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. He said,
- J: 'Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want.'
- N: He came and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter,
- J: 'Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep awake one hour? Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.'
- N: And again he went away and prayed, saying the same words. And once more he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to say to him. He came a third time and said to them,
- J: 'Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Enough! The hour has come; the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand.'
- N: Immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived; and with him there was a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,
- All: 'The one I will kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away under guard.'

N: So when he came, he went up to him at once and said,

All: 'Rabbi!'

N: and he kissed him.

Then they laid hands on him and arrested him.

N: Let us pray:

Lord Jesus, you were betrayed by the kiss of a friend:

be with those who are betrayed and slandered and falsely accused.

You knew the experience of having your love

thrown back in your face for mere silver:

be with families which are torn apart by mistrust or temptation.

And so in Jesus' name we pray:

For those who have been deserted by friends,

and those who have betrayed.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: For those who can no longer trust another.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: For those who are tempted to violence.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: That all the faithful may be watchful and awake to the suffering of all God's

children.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: To you, Jesus, who offered your face to your betrayer, be honour and glory with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

Jesus On Trial

Mark 14:66-72, John 18: 28-40

Narrator: We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you,

All: because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

N: Meanwhile, Peter was in the courtyard below. One of the servant girls who worked for the high priest came by and noticed Peter warming himself at the fire. She looked at him closely and said, "You were one of those with Jesus of Nazareth." But Peter denied it.

All: "I don't know what you're talking about,"

N: he said, and he went out into the entryway. Just then, a rooster crowed. When the servant girl saw him standing there, she began telling the others, "This man is definitely one of them!" But Peter denied it again.

A little later some of the other bystanders confronted Peter and said, "You must be one of them, because you are a Galilean." Peter swore,

All: "A curse on me if I'm lying—I don't know this man you're talking about!"

N: And immediately the rooster crowed the second time.

Suddenly, Jesus' words flashed through Peter's mind:

"Before the rooster crows twice,
you will deny three times that you even know me."

And he broke down and wept.

SONG: IN OUR DARKNESS [Click/tab to listen]

In our darkness, there is no darkness with you O Lord, the deepest night in clear as the day.

(Sing 2 times)

N: Then they took Jesus from Caiaphas to Pilate's headquarters. It was early in the morning. They themselves did not enter the headquarters, so as to avoid ritual defilement and to be able to eat the Passover. So Pilate went out to them and said, 'What accusation do you bring against this man?'

They answered,

All: 'If this man were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you.'

N: Pilate said to them, 'Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law.'

The Jews replied,

All: 'We are not permitted to put anyone to death.'

N: (This was to fulfil what Jesus had said when he indicated the kind of death he was to die.)

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' Jesus answered,

J: 'Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?'

N: Pilate replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' Jesus answered,

J: 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.'

N: Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered,

J: 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

N: Pilate asked him, 'What is truth?'

After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, 'I find no case against him. But you have a custom that I release someone for you at the Passover. Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?'

They shouted in reply,

All: 'Not this man, but Barabbas!'

N: Now Barabbas was a bandit.

Jesus scourged and takes up the cross

Mark 15:1-15

Narrator: Then the soldiers led him into the courtyard of the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters); and they called together the whole cohort.

And they clothed him in a purple cloak; and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on him.

And they began saluting him,

All: 'Hail, King of the Jews!'

N: They struck his head with a reed, spat upon him, and knelt down in homage to him. After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

help us to realize the extent and the cost of your love for us.

And so in Jesus' name we pray:

For those whose burden is heavy this day.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: For those who have endured abuse.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: For those who stand up for justice and mercy.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: That we may always seek to do your will.

Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

N: To you, Jesus, bearing a cross not your own,

be honour and glory with the Father and the Holy Spirit,

now and for ever.

Amen.

Narrator: A great number of the people followed him, and among them were

women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. But Jesus turned to

your children. For the days are surely coming when they will say, "Blessed are

the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed."

Then they will begin to say to the mountains, "Fall on us"; and to the hills, "Cover

us." For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?'

N: Let us pray:

Lord Jesus, the women of Jerusalem wept for you:
move us to tears at the plight of the broken in our world.
You embraced the pain of Jerusalem, the 'city of peace':

The Crucifixion of Jesus

Mark 15:22-32a, Luke 23:39-43, John 19:26, 27, Mark 15:33-39; 42-47

Narrator: We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you,

All: because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

N: Then they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of

a skull). And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh; but he did not take it. And

they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide

what each should take.

It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. The inscription of

the charge against him read, 'The King of the Jews.' And with him they crucified

two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided

him, shaking their heads and saying,

All: 'Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save

yourself, and come down from the cross!'

N: In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, were also mocking him among themselves and saying,

All: 'He saved others; he cannot save himself.

Let the Messiah, the King of Israel,

come down from the cross now, so that we may see and believe.'

N: One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying,

All: 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!'

N: But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

He replied,

Jesus: 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

N: When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother,

J: 'Woman, here is your son.'

N: Then he said to the disciple,

J: 'Here is your mother.'

N: And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

N: When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice,

J: 'Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?'

N: which means, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

All: 'Listen, he is calling for Elijah.'

N: And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, 'Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.'

Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

You may pause in silence.

N: And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, 'Truly this man was God's Son!'

linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then

rolled a stone against the door of the tomb.

Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where the body was laid.
