Sermon Seung Jae Yeon


As I begin my sharing of reflection, I would like to introduce interesting survey results about *Spirituality in Australia 2020*. We may all agree that last year it was a challenging year for most of us. No matter what stage in life we live, what belief or faith we practice, or what values and virtues we own. It was and even today is still challenging us and our being. This figure could indicate us where we are going through in living and believing in Jesus Christ.

The survey was conducted by National Church Life Surveys which is a research project taken place every five years since 1991. The research of NCLS studies about Australian spirituality, church health, leadership and connection between church and community. I believe that we, Boronia Park has joined this survey as part of Uniting Church is Australia out of

20 Christians denominations. The survey titled 2020 Australian's Spiritual Practices in a Year of Crises tells as its result that nearly seven in Australians affirm spiritual practices as important during crisis, particularly including bushfires and the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Importance of spiritual practices in context of crisis

In the context of this year's crises (including bushfires and the COVID-19 pandemic), how important do you think spiritual practices are to support people's wellbeing?



In the same survey, there is another question asking the participants about spiritual practices in 2020 versus 2019. Some 45 per cent of Australians

answered yes. Some 24 per cent said it had been at the same rate as in 2019, whereas 15 per cent of those had increased their level of spiritual practice. Thankfully some Australian Christians have been practicing their own spirituality during such a period of stress and crisis.


Australians' spiritual practices in 2020 vs 2019

In more detail, the survey studies about the participants' specific spiritual practices in 2020. Spending time outdoors in nature and listening to music were the two most popular spiritual practices that people might lift



one's spirit. In comparison to that, both church worship services, either in person or online, and small groups show a decrease whereas music, nature, prayer and meditation show its increase.

I totally agree with the result. That is what we have been at and how we have practiced our faith in God, our belief in spirituality and our own way to follow words and deeds of Jesus Christ. I have no doubt that we, Christians have come seek God and His presence more and more in this period of challenges and changes. We have drawn more and more on whatever we practice affirming and reaffirming our connection with God. God is God always there for us. Jesus is Jesus always there waiting for us. The Spirit is the Spirit always around us hovering for protection and care. The ways that we might seek to find them are changed but we still need God and His great help in our daily life. I am sure that you agree with me.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus on the mountain is still Jesus for his disciples, Peter, James and John, and for his all followers. Jesus keeps calling all disciples to join Him. In this call to discipleship, with Jesus'

transfiguration, God shows Himself exactly the same when He be with Moses and Elijah. On the mountain, Jesus with two great heroes represents the Law and the Prophets. Jesus, as He is, is viewed like a holy and sacred figure that his clothes become super, talking with the heroes. But He does not attempt to bring those important heritages of the past Israel's religion on to Himself and His ministry. Jesus, no matter what or how He looks like, is Jesus for those disciples on the mountain and those followers who are waiting for Him down the mountain.

Peter misunderstands meanwhile for the call. He However, misunderstands what it means to be with Jesus who is transfigured before him. He attempts to build three tabernacles as his ancestors attempted and box them in that framework of tradition and show-off his occupation of God. Maybe Peter attempts to change the image of Jesus from a humble and servant king to a victorious and glorious emperor. So Peter is again challenged, this time by the divine voice itself. "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to Him!" There are only three disciples with Jesus. "Listen to Him!" They are simply endorsed again by the voice to follow Jesus. This is Jesus' call to discipleship. Listen to me! Peter's attempts to box the Presence of God is dismissed. Jesus again teaches that the Presence of God in Him is available for all whoever believe in and follow Him. Moses and Elijah are gone. The mirage is removed. On the mountain, Jesus with Peter, James and John is there for all presenting God's purpose and will. Jesus is Jesus there for them, for you, for me and for many. This is God's will on Him, I truly believe.

I used to question my faith during the pandemic. I questioned to myself about what it means to be the Church? To be honest, I had more attention and values on the Church as gathered people. This means a gathered people is the Church when in person at a designated place like worship space. One part of my brain worked so hard to prepare all our online worship resources and approaches of pastoral care in various ways. At the same time, on part of my soul wondered whether our identity as the church is valid during a period of time not to gather in person. I was a bit doubtful. So hard to get out of the foolishness and struggles for my own soul and our church health. There was fortunately a critical moment that I had and I was with a number of our church members and it rescued me who wanted to box the Presence of God in physical space or certain time like Peter's attempts. This is my testimony.

Last year, on Sunday 1 November, All Saints Day, a number of young families of our church were invited by Meridith to meet with Heather McDowell who is now in heaven. It was a Sunday afternoon, cold and showered outside. Fifteen people plus two gathered in Heather's lounge. All became aware that her time was not too long with us. So, on Meridith's request, we sang two songs — Come As You Are and May the Feet of God together for her. It followed a prayer of blessing on her and Rosemary, her elder spoke of words of assurance and blessing. It was a huge privilege for me to be part of Heather's life and her very last moment as Christian friend and church minister. Also she taught me in that gathering and even today that we who were in the lounge formed a church in person, and are still a church in remembrance of who she was for us. That gathering underscores the importance of gathered people as the church. And remembering Heather's life and her giftedness of caring people is also forming a church if I still live it out this moment. I cannot box Heather's presence and her love. And I cannot institutionalise the

Presence of God but only follow it until He comes again. Now I am relieved from the struggle and now free ever before.

The Church is the Church there for us. We are the Church no matter where we gather or what we practice today. What we want is Jesus Christ, who walks with us in this life's journey, always willingly helps us, and silently listens to us and our prayers. Then Jesus is Jesus who let us do His Father's will in our life, though we are now in a period of stress and challenges. Let us hold fast to the Word speaking of Jesus Christ who is always at the same place, our soul and spirit, our mind and body, and our gathering and scattering. Let us welcome Jesus who may transform our lives today. In this year, we will need Jesus more and more.
